This Agreement made the 18th day of August, 1993, by and between the
undernoted parties.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Kawasaki Kisen Kaisha, Ltd., Mitsui O.S.K. Lines, Ltd. and Nippon
Yusen Kaisha are parties to Discussion Agreement No. 203-010905, as amended,
entitled the "Japanese-Flag Far East-United States Discussion Agreement,"

WHEREAS, American President Lines, Ltd. and A.P. MOLLER-MAERSK
SEALAND are parties to Discussion Agreement No. 203-010050, as amended, entitled
the "U.S.-Flag Far East Discussion Agreement," and

WHEREAS, the parties to each Agreement desire to amend their respective
Discussion Agreements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual
undertakings of the parties, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. NAME OF THE AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT shall be known as the "Japanese-United States Carrier
Discussion Agreement In The Asia-United States Trades."



2. PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT.

The purpose of this AGREEMENT is to promote stability and cooperation in the Asia and United States trades among U.S. and Japanese flag carriers on matters common to the scopes of their respective Discussion Agreements.

3. PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT.

The names and principal office addresses of the parties to the Agreement are listed in Appendix A hereto.

4. GEOGRAPHIC SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT.

The Agreement's geographic scope shall extend to ports and points in trades between Asia and the United States, including interior and coastal points in the United States via U.S. ports. "Asia" is defined to include Japan, Siberia, Korea, People's Republic of China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Macao, Thailand, Democratic Kampuchea (Cambodia), Vietnam, Singapore, Malaysia, Laos, Burma, Brunei, Philippines and Indonesia. "United States" means the several states thereof, its commonwealths, territories and possessions.

5. AGREEMENT AUTHORITY.

A. The parties hereto are authorized to meet together under their respective Discussion Agreements and discuss, exchange information, and reach agreements upon, and strictly limited to,

matters of mutual concern which are common to the scopes of their Agreements, as amended. As this Agreement is not a conference or rate-fixing agreement, it does not authorize (other than the taking and presentment of common positions) the parties to fix, change or implement, jointly or individually, any rate, charge, rule, regulation or practice whether or not required to be filed under section 8 of the Shipping Act of 1984.

B. The parties to each Discussion Agreement shall, from time-to-time, designate a person from their respective memberships to serve as Chairman to preside over all meetings and coordinate exchanges, as required. The parties hereto shall agree upon a schedule for alternating the persons so designated between each Agreement's membership. Such meetings may be held at times and places as the parties may agree. In lieu of meetings, the parties may take actions hereunder via facsimile or other electronic means. The parties may appoint committees as they deem desirable to report upon matters and to make recommendations, but not to take final action. The filing of minutes and other procedural matters except as otherwise provided herein, shall be governed by, and under, the parties respective Discussion Agreements, provided the parties may agree upon the content of the minutes which are the subject of their common activities.

C. Upon the filing of this Agreement with the Federal

Maritime Commission, the parties hereby agree to file with the Commission the following amendment to Article 5 of their respective Discussion Agreements:

The parties to this AGREEMENT are also authorized to meet together, discuss, consider, exchange information and reach agreements with the parties to U.S.-Flag Far East Discussion Agreement No. 203-010050, as amended [Japanese-Flag Far East-United States Discussion Agreement No. 203-010905, as amended,] upon matters of mutual concern common to the scopes of the two Agreements. No agreement or understanding reached under this Agreement which is required to be filed under the Shipping Act of 1984 shall be implemented until such agreement is filed with the Commission and becomes effective under the provisions of the said Act.

6. AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES
